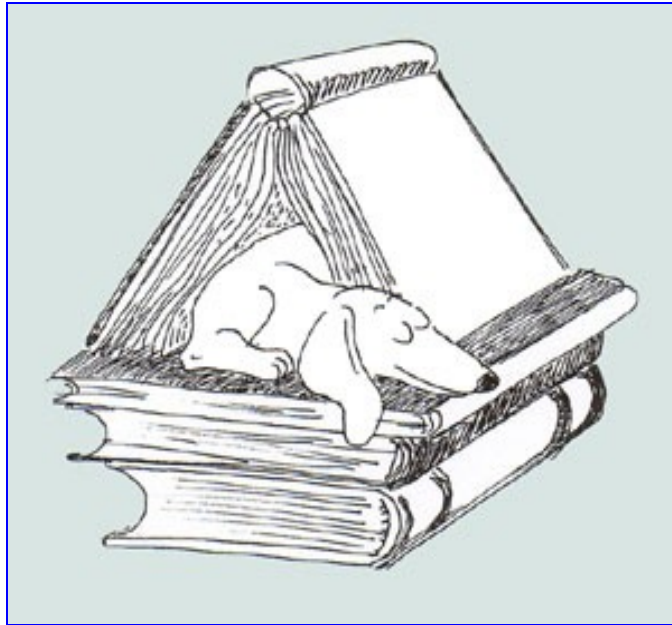

**Wary and Weary Travelers: The African-American Travel Experience in Jim Crow Kentucky.**

In Jim Crow Kentucky, African Americans had to know if the proprietors of rest stops or filling stations would refuse them service or be outright hostile. Higgins will discuss the *Green Book Travel* that African Americans used to travel through the state. She'll discuss how neighbors and neighborhoods created opportunities for African Americans to vacation and safely travel during segregation, and how that influenced the Civil Rights movement.

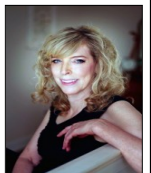
Only a few scholars are familiar with Cavalry Commander, Col. Frank Lane Wolford and his Wild Riders. "Red tape" Union military leaders considered his style too independent and irregular. The Wild Riders, wild mountain men, understood his homespun commands and obeyed him. His antithesis, the aristocratic rebel raider, John Hunt Morgan, considered "Wild Wolf" the most feared and dreaded Union Cavalry Commander. This is Wolford's military and political history during and after the Civil War.





George Rogers Clark came to Kentucky as a surveyor, but made his mark as a military leader during the Revolutionary War. In 1777, Virginia governor Patrick Henry approved Clark's secret mission to attack British posts north of the Ohio River. Clark launched a campaign into present-day Illinois and Indiana, defeating the British and their Indian allies and securing the Northwest Territory. Meanwhile, the settlers Clark brought along moved from Corn Island to Kentucky, founding the city of Louisville in late 1778. His war exploits marked the peak of Clark's career. He spent his later years living in Louisville, plagued by debts, drinking and in poor health. Overshadowed by his brother William, of Lewis and Clark fame, he died dispirited.
