



Monday, March 13, 11 AM




Local History Potluck Dinner Program

Tom Eblen, the popular Lexington Herald-Leader columnist, claims that one of his favorite places to go is the Lower Howard's Creek Nature and Heritage Preserve in southern Clark County. Last year he wrote that "like many of the creeks that flow to the Kentucky River through a unique ecosystem called the Palisades, Lower Howard's Creek is a natural wonderland of rare plants, wildlife, cliffs, waterfalls and the stone remnants of pioneer structures." Many locals agree with Eblen's assessment and include the preserve on their "to-do list" when entertaining out of town guests. Come and join us when Clare Sipple, the preserve manager, visits to talk about notable improvements to the preserve and to update us about this historic Clark County treasure.
